Dear Municipal Law Enforcement Officer:

I am contacting you to ask that you take a couple minutes to complete this anonymous questionnaire as part of an important research project that will be useful for law enforcement regarding the issue of gangs. This survey research will result in a national needs assessment which we expect will help justify additional resources for municipal and county law enforcement agencies.

Our agency, the National Gang Crime Research Center, has systematically monitored the gang problem since 1990. The intelligence and information developed by our agency shows the gang problem is now affecting most communities in the United States. If you are lucky enough to have a community that remains untouched by the gang problem, then we still need to hear from you.

We can reward you directly with useful information if you send back a completed questionnaire within thirty (30) days: then we will be able to send you a complete copy of our report analyzing the gang problem in the USA today. So you will get rapid useful information at no cost as a responding agency. The report will be sent only to responding agencies.

New federal gang legislation is likely to make additional resources available to agencies like yours if there is a proven need, and the report we intend to release may justify additional resources for your agency. From our experience we also know that state laws could also be strengthened as a result of this kind of report and it is our belief that some special attention in that direction would be a healthy development.
